



Slide 40	Geriatric Dispensing Special Considerations – Driving at Night  20/20 aculty during the day drops to 20/32 at night  Add a pink 2 fint and aculty drops to 40-  Windshields absorb an average of 20% of available light	
Slide 41	Geriatric Dispensing Special Considerations - Driving at Night  Any tint chosen for night driving is counter-productive  A.R. is always the better choice  except when it's not.  If a patient INSISTS on a fint for night driving, the ECP should INSIST on A.R.	
Slide 42	Geriatric Dispensing Special Considerations – Photochromics  Even in its lightened state, a photochromic lens transmits less light  Takes time to lighten. In the meantime  Transitions  Generally, as people age, they

# Geriatric Dispensing Special Considerations – Home Lighting Most home lighting is inadequate for optimal vision... especially reading. Suggest replacing some bulbs with higher wattage bulbs... especially in kitchen, living room, and hobby areas. Have a good resource for low-vision aids as necessary. Be sure to suggest Task Glasses.


